This practical workshop is aimed at teachers and practitioners, generalists and specialists working musically with children in Key Stages 1 and 2 (ages 5–11) both in and out of school.

Many teachers feel unsure how to support children in composing their own music. Yet composition is the moment when children move beyond imitation and begin to use their musical skills independently — shaping rhythm, melody and texture through their own ideas.

Ofsted repeatedly identified composing as one of the weakest areas of music teaching in schools. This workshop explores practical, creative and fun ways to address this.
